

AGM 2010 REPORT

The meeting was held on Saturday 13th February in Church of the Holy Cross and St Mary Quainton and was attended by 25 CBB members representing 12 branches and the ODG Deputy Master, North Bucks Branch Chairman and 2 NBB visitors (list available on request)

Jan Robinson took the Chair. She reported on the deaths of four well known and respected ringers during the year. Bill Thatcher- long term tower captain of Padbury and honorary ODG member; Maurice Jamieson – founder member of the branch and tower captain of Gt Horwood; Reg Darvill – branch vice president and ODG honorary member; Katrina Dalton of Quainton.

New members: 10 people were nominated viz Stewkley: 5, Wingrave: 1,,Winslow: 2,Aylesbury: 1, Gt Horwood 1 (re-election)

Distinguished Member nomination – under the new rules the meeting supported Chairman Jan Robinson's nomination of Terry Wagstaff (Whitchurch) for consideration by the ODG

Written reports were received from all officers – copies are available on request Committee – your new committee was elected (see P6 &4) there are 2 vacancies: Deputy Chairman and Branch Steward. (If you are interested please let the sec know)

Transfer of towers to N Bucks Branch

It was resolved to recommend to the ODG General Committee that Padbury and Hillesden be transferred from the remit of the Central Bucks Branch to the North Bucks Branch. This will take effect from the date of the ODG General Committee at which it is accepted

Bits & Bobs – Hal reported on the new **website** (see Poster), Diana agreed to take on the **cbb newsletter** and to look at our current ways of circulating things; We talked about **Recruitment** and later on how we might increase the branch's donation to **The ODG Bell Fund** as we are currently net benefactors. ringing master report

Well...what should I say?? I do feel I'm occupying the position of Ringing Master rather fraudulently as my credentials are certainly not on a par with those who have preceded me! All I can say is: 'I will do my best', to continue the good work that's been done in the Branch recently, with the help of all of you members out there.

The calendar for the Branch Practices is out and it would be great to see a growing number of people attending. The April practice will be at Mursley, in the morning at 10.00, so perhaps that might suit some of you better than the traditional early evening? Suggestions welcome for future practices...

We had a good **Improver's practice** at Stewkley in February organised by Hal – this is a great opportunity for the less experienced to meet others and get a buzz from trying something new! I'm pretty sure that if you asked anyone who came to this they'd recommend it to you. It's very relaxed but focussed too – what more could you need for an enjoyable evening (plus the pub afterwards too of course, for those that want to!)

I hope everyone's visited the **new website** to see what's been happening in the Branch recently. Watch out for other events being planned for the coming months...

On that note, may I remind everyone that June 12th is the date of the 6-bell Striking Competition, and it's not too early to start thinking about who is going to be in your band. More details will be sent around nearer the time, and we'll need names by the end of May. Remember, it's about encouraging us all to work on our striking, while also enjoying the social occasion on the day. You don't have to be able to ring complicated methods; you've just as good a chance of winning if your band is doing call-changes as if you're doing Surprise Minor. It's how you ring that counts!

Here are the Guidelines:

Membership of Teams.

A Tower Band shall consist of members who normally ring together at the same tower for Sunday Services, whether or not they ring at more than one tower and shall be chosen by the Tower in any way it thinks fit. One substitute member shall be permitted who shall be a member of the Branch in which the tower is located.

Six Bell Competition

The test piece will consist of at least one minute's rounds followed by 240 changes of any method of Doubles (6 plain courses) or Minor (4 plain courses) or 240 rows of call changes. If a method is rung then plain courses will be acceptable. If call changes are rung then at least 30 changes must be called and at least the front 5 different bells brought down to lead.

ODG BELL FUND

More In than Out

Terry Wagstaff sums it up

Bell ringing must be one of the cheapest hobbies going. We can tower grab around the country, and to a limited extent abroad, at over 7000 plus towers; all that might be expected from us is donation, perhaps £1 or £2. As Winslow and other towers, who have had work done on the bells, have found the cost to the church is expensive. Typically re-hanging projects can cost up to £30,000. So our direct contribution to the cost of the bells we enjoy is very small.

This Branch, for the whole thirty plus years that the Bell Fund has been in existence, has on average donated around £100 per annum. Recently even our already small annual contribution has been falling. We have relied on the Branch Monthly "Swindle" Draw (see below). So we have benefited greatly and given little!

The purpose of this short piece is to ask Branch members to

- Give greater support to the Branch draw,
- Suggest ways to the Branch Chairman / Secretary about how we could augment our financial contribution to the Bell Fund,
- Encourage individual members to donate (with Gift Aid if you are a UK taxpayer) directly to the Bell Fund, and,
- Ask that PCCs, especially those that have received grants, consider making a small annual church contribution.
