Special Practices

6 Bell Ringing

Throughout this year the Branch has been running a series of practices dedicated to developing specific areas of ringing for those who would like to make progress in their change ringing.

In addition to the regular monthly branch practices, which operate as a free for all, there is a Tuesday practice where the aim is to allow individuals the opportunity of ringing what they want to ring, with a band of competent ringers. Each touch is arranged specifically for the individual, so that other, perhaps less competent, ringers do not impede the progress of the individual whose turn it is.

At present we have perhaps 8 learners attending regularly, and they are working through from plain hunt on 5, Plain Bob Doubles, Grandsire Doubles and up to Treble Bobbing and Cambridge Minor. We can, of course, ring anything required so, if there is anything you would like to try, just come along.

Until the end of 2009 the practices are being held at Stewkley, 7.30 to 9pm. The dates, slightly irregular unfortunately, but all Tuesdays, are as follows:

15th September13th October10th November8th December

The words "Surprise Major" are apt to strike fear into the hearts of those who do not ring such things. Of course, such fears are irrational, but there is undoubtedly an assumption that such ringing is elitist. Not so. It is there as a development of change ringing which is there for everyone, provided there are enough ringers to do it! Like anything else, it requires learning and practise.

Fortunately, in the CBB, there has been a regular practice which has been running for over 30 years, which is dedicated to providing the opportunity for ringers to progress into Surprise Major ringing. Far from being elitist, this practice welcomes interest from anyone willing to try. We do however expect newcomers to at least be change ringers - from there onwards it's just a case of helping them to acquire the different skills required and we will, where necessary, ring other 7 or 8 bell methods to help them bridge the gap.

Why not come and give it a try? You will be well looked after. After all, it is in the interests of the Surprise Major band to look after people who would like to try it - otherwise the local Surprise Major ringing may die out.

These practices are currently held on the third Thursday of the month and are usually at Haddenham or Cuddington. If you are interested, please let me know and I will add you to the email list for notifying practices. You will then at least know when and where the practices are, with no pressure to attend until you're ready.

I'm sure the Long Crendon ringers won't mind me mentioning that their weekly practice on 10 bells is held every Thursday.

Branch Striking Competition 2009

This year's striking competition was held at St James' Church, Great Horwood, where there are 6 bells, with a tenor of 16-0-10 in F. There were six teams that entered, who were, in the order that they rang:

1st - St. Mary's, Aylesbury

2nd - St. Laurence's, Winslow

3rd - All Saints, Wing (A)

4th - All Saints, Wing (B)

5th - Winslow 'Scratch' Team

6th - St. Mary's, East Claydon

So, once the ringers and the judge (+ trainee judge) were ready in their places, the first team began; the practice was two minutes of whatever the team wanted to ring, then 4 strikes (or more for some of us!!) of the treble signified to the judges that the test piece was to follow. The test piece consisted of one minute of rounds followed by either 120 changes of any method or call changes with every bell (apart from the tenor) coming down to lead.
