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#### AGM 2011 Report

27 CBB members representing 14 towers attended the AGM in Winslow together with the ODG Secretary. Jan Robinson took the Chair and conducted a brisk meeting lasting an hour enabling post as well as pre meeting ringing.

The previous AGM *minutes* were accepted without change and reports received from the officers (copies available on request). The 2010 account were adopted.

16 new members were elected but there were no nominations for Distinguished Membership.

The elections saw the re-election of many people but Jan Vowles stood down from Deputy Ringing Master.

Ryan Noble became the 2<sup>nd</sup> Branch Steward and Caroline Luxford took over from Hal as the 2<sup>nd</sup> Branch Rep. (see P 4 for list)

*New projects* were agreed in the areas: Bell maintenance expertise; Wedding & Funeral availability register; Mid week ringers group. (see Chairman's Clatter & 6 on how to take part.)

On the *Communications* front, Ryan Noble reported that he was having problems getting the ODG to establish good email lists for us. He also appealed for material for the *website*. Diana Slevin apologised for not having mastered circulation of print material, reported that the ODG annual report would be available in .pdf format and that the guild was asking for feedback on whether this could replace print versions and said that the newsletter format would be made easier to home print.

Young Ringers & Recruitment - with considerable progress being made in recruiting and supporting young ringers, members were invited to share some ideas. These included:

Open Days, Junior school initiatives, speaking at Family Services, working with other branches, involving parents, making it fun, forming a social group, giving a Bell tuition course as a raffle prize....

Branch programme (see also Ringing Master's report)

A provisional *List of Events* for the year was circulated ( see extract P5) Towers for the traditional *Saturday Branch practices* are being chosen on a 3year cycle looking at geographic spread, numbers of bells and other considerations when planning. It was suggested that perhaps one of the practices in the winter months could be planned for the morning to mitigate against weather conditions and travel difficulties *Guild Events* were noted on the Diary of Events sheet including the AGM 21<sup>st</sup> May in Bicester Branch. *Striking Competitions* the 6 bell striking comp will be at North Marston on June 11<sup>th</sup> and CBB is hosting the Orchard Cup on October 8<sup>th</sup> at East Claydon. Members were urged to encourage more teams to enter. A Youth team and other scratch teams took part at Whitchurch last year which had added to the fun in addition to choosing the team for the Guild 6 bell competition. A BBQ afterwards had added to the occasion.. It is hoped to build on this success in 2011.

September Branch outing – Ryan offered to organise this with Kate Edgar sorting the transport.

Christmas Dinner - The last one had taken place in Bierton in January and had been very successful with 33 people attending. The next one will be on January 14<sup>th</sup> 2012 at a venue to be decided

Ringing World Centenary March 26<sup>th</sup> London. Ryan reported that this will include features such as Whitechapel Foundry open, Towers open, City Walks, Exhibitions and mini rings, Young Ringers striking competition, Westminster Abbey activities, etc and that some tickets were still available

AOB: Grandsire Quarter Peal by Grandparent ringers – Richard Goldson reported that Edmund Waller was seeking to set this up this year and called for volunteers.

Meeting thanks: from the Chair, Jan Robinson offered the meeting's thanks to all at Winslow for their hard work in enabling the AGM notably the Rector Belinda Searle-Barnes, Tower Captains Diana Slevin and Mandy Cliffe and Winslow ringers for the teas.
