## **RINGING MASTER'S REPORT – AGM 2011**

I am pleased to report that this last year has continued the trend of increased participation in Branch activities and opportunities for ringing together. The level of complexity of methods that have been rung has increased, and there are also a healthy number of learners within the Branch taking their 'first steps'. What is particularly encouraging is the number of younger learners who are maintaining their interest in all things campanological, for they hold the future of ringing in their hands. My personal thanks to all those who are giving a lot of their time to nurturing this interest so competently.

Following on from last year we have had a similar 'diary' of Branch activities this year. The first and third Tuesdays of each month have been 'Improvers'' practices, held at Aylesbury and Stewkley respectively, for those who can handle a bell in rounds onwards. There has been a good regular nucleus of attendees, with new ringers joining them. There was even a practice during the snowy weather of December! This practice continues to be very flexible, aiming to meet the particular needs of those who arrive on the day. It has been managed very successfully by Hal Drysdale, the Branch Training Officer. My thanks to him.

The second Saturday has continued the tradition of being the main Branch Practice held at towers around the area. We have had a good and varied turnout with an interesting mix in the ringing on 5 – 10 bells. The 'Advanced' Practice became a full Branch event and was moved to the fourth Saturday, as a trial initially. This has proved to be a success. Branch tower practice nights have been avoided, and ringers from other areas now regularly join us. This has enabled us to increase the opportunities offered hugely and, as with the main Branch Practice, to aim to provide a challenge for all attendees. Ringers with a minimum standard of Stedman Triples / 'treble bobbing' on 8 are welcome, as are Spliced Surprise ringers!

In June the Branch Striking Competition was won by Wing, with a novice band, at Whitchurch. They then went on to represent us at the Guild Competition. This was the first time for several years that the Branch has entered a 6-bell team at Guild level. Alan Bentley and Simon Lockwood from Chiltern Branch were our judges this year.

The Branch was also very well represented at the Guild 10-bell Striking Competition by a team based around ringers from Long Crendon. The competition was held at Amersham. The judges commented that the standard of ringing was such that this band must have local connections! They were placed second, by a narrow margin.

The Orchard Cup competition was held in October, hosted by the Chiltern Branch at Ellesborough. Aylesbury successfully retained the cup for the Branch for the third year running. It is good to think that the Branch is making its presence felt at these events.

There have been three Branch outings this year. Our main outing took place in September, this year to the London area which provided a new experience for many and was enjoyed by all. In June we also had a second very popular 'steam and ring' family outing; to the GWR at Cheltenham; and then, at the beginning of September, a young ringers' outing was organised to Big Ben, with all the places being filled very quickly.

The year ended with over 30 of us, representing 10 Branch and 3 visitors' towers, enjoying a good meal in Bierton for the dinner, after a shortened Practice. My main difficulty? Fitting everyone in to ring! A good way to end a successful year.

I would like to thank all those, 'officials' and others, who have helped to arrange towers and activities this year. The programme has truly been a team effort of which we can be proud, and which has made the ringing in our Branch such an enjoyable, sociable, but challenging activity for us all.

## **BRANCH REPRESENTATIVES REPORT**

Matters arising from previous minutes:

Branch Secretaries are to be asked to offer to towers the option of a PDF version of the Guild Report this year, to help reduce wastage and cut down costs.

Ringing for St George's Day. Because this will fall on Easter Eve this year generally any ringing should only be undertaken after discussion with, and support from, the incumbent.

St Cross in Oxford. A lot of work has been done to get the bells removed but the Listed Buildings Council has ruled, sadly, that they stay put.

Correspondence:

The Guild, after invitation, has voted to give £40 to sponsor the Ringing World Centenary Celebrations.

The Treasurer has received more enquiries regarding the Guild's personal accident insurance. As it seems to be costly for smaller associations the idea that the Central Council might consider a universal scheme will be put to it.

To achieve greater accuracy for the Guild report it is suggested that conductors send full details of peals to the Peal Secretary, along with the fees, for peals rung in December. This will get around the problem of late publication in the Ringing World.

Reports of the Sub-committees:

Education:

The young ringers award last took place in 2008 and it will happen again in 2011. Details are on the Website.

Towers & Belfries:

Concerns regarding insurance were raised as to what happens when a report by a professional company is overridden by private individuals masquerading as experts, but with no professional indemnity .The incumbent of the church should be made aware as the insurance could be invalid. The Vicar, PCC and Churchwardens would bear the responsibility.

Central Council Representatives' Report:

The Ringing Committee (which superceded the Trends Committee) and the Central Council are particularly concerned with the recruitment and retention of young ringers. The Trends Committee report shows that the average age of ringers is increasing year by year. The Ringing Committee is engaged in a survey of the towers that have been successful in recruiting and retaining young ringers and are investigating strategies for success.

Subscriptions: These will remain at £6 for all in 2011.

Peal fees: These will remain at 40 pence per person for 2011.

Festival 2011

There was much discussion regarding this. The Guild Master and Secretary have been given a free hand to organise it at Christ Church in Oxford.
